

DID YOU KNOW OUR SERVICE LEVELS ON SIDEWALK & TRAILS SNOW REMOVAL?





HOW LONG DO I HAVE TO REMOVE SNOW FROM MY SIDEWALK?

The Town of Slave Lake asks that all residents begin the snow removal process on sidewalks in front of their properties within 24 hours after the snow falls.

WHERE CAN I PUT SNOW FROM MY SIDEWALK?

It is against town bylaws to shovel snow from your driveway and the sidewalk in front of your house, onto the street.

Residents who do shovel their sidewalk into the street can face a potential fine from the Town of Slave Lake.



HOW DOES THE TOWN OF SLAVE LAKE ENFORCE SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL?

The Town of Slave Lake's Enforcement Services patrols high traffic areas during the winter months.

Upon receiving a complaint from a Town Resident, Enforcement Services attends the scene of the complaint to open a report.

Photographic evidence of the sidewalk in question is taken, and then a door knocker is hung on the residence outlining the infraction and notifying the resident of when the sidewalk must be cleaned.

Enforcement Services returns to the property in question at a later date. If the snow from the sidewalk has not been removed a ticket can be issued.

IF SNOW IS CLEARED TO MY SIDE OF THE ROAD DO I NEED TO REMOVE IT FROM THE SIDEWALK IN FRONT OF MY PROPERTY?

No, if the Town of Slave Lake snow crews plow snow to your side of the street, you are not required to remove snow from the sidewalks in front of your home.

Residents who do not have snow plowed to their side of the street are required to remove snow from their sidewalks.



WHO IS IN CHARGE OF REMOVING SNOW FROM ALLARIE TRAILS?

It is the responsibility of the Town of Slave Lake to remove snow from Allarie Trails within the Town of Slave Lake.

Within 48 hours of last snow fall, the Town of Slave Lake's Parks and Facilities begins the process of removing snow from Allarie Trails.



ON MAIN STREET THERE ARE SIDEWALKS, WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THOSE?

The Town of Slave Lake's Parks and Facilities Crews are responsible for the sidewalks from Highway 2 to the CN train tracks (including Citizen's Park), the sidewalks in front of Fournier Place, as well as

walk throughs throughout the Town.

During icy conditions, the Town of Slave Lake puts down a mixture of pea gravel and salt.

This is initiated within 48 hours of last snow fall.
